

## **ANNEXURE A**

### **AUSTRALIAN GOLFING FELLOWSHIP OF ROTARIANS INC BY-LAWS**

#### **1. Annual Tournament**

- 1.1 In order to participate in an Australian Golfing Fellowship of Rotarians tournament, an entrant shall:
  - 1.1.1 Be a member of a Rotary Club
  - 1.1.2 Be a member of a recognised Golf Club
  - 1.1.3 Have an official Australian golf handicap or equivalent
  - 1.1.4 Pay the AGFR Annual Subscription
- 1.2 Rotarians who comply with 1.1.1; 1.1.2; 1.1.3 and 1.1.4 shall be classed as Participating Rotarians.
- 1.3 A Rotarian who complies with 1.1.2; 1.1.3; and 1.1.4 but resides outside Australia may compete in the Tournament but is not eligible for the Clem Renouf, Royce Abbey or Victorian trophies. This participant shall be classed as a "Rotarian Guest".

#### **2. Tournament Application**

- 2.1 Applications to conduct an Annual Tournament from Rotarians representing a State or a Rotary Club must be submitted in writing to the Secretary/Treasurer at least two months prior to the Annual General Meeting.
- 2.2 The application should include the location of the Tournament, dates of the Tournament, availability of accommodation, costs, letters of acceptance from Golf Clubs and other relevant details.
- 2.3 The application may or may not include competitions for guests.

#### **3. Tournament Program**

- 3.1 The Fellowship Tournament shall be played over not less than two days. An earlier day be reserved for practice, subject to green fees and arrangements being made with the Clubs concerned.
- 3.2 There may be a 72 holes but not less than a 36 holes Aggregate Stableford Teams event.
- 3.3 The Tournament may be played on more than one golf course.
- 3.4 Individual Stableford Competitions of 18 holes shall be played each day concurrently with 3.2.
- 3.5 The discretion as to whether 72, 54 or 36 Holes be played, in 3.2 and 3.4 above shall be left to the State Tournament Committee but must be advised in the Entry Forms.
- 3.6 Awards shall be made to the players with the highest Stableford scores, for each 18 holes and the aggregate of 36, 54 or 72 holes of the Tournament for the divisions set out in 3.4.

4. **Tournament Rules**

- 4.1 The Rules are those of “The Rules of Golf as approved by R&A Rules Limited and the United States Golf Association” supplemented by any local rules.
- 4.2 A Match Committee appointed by the tournament Committee will settle all disputes.
- 4.3 In the event of a tie the winner of a tie or ties shall be decided by a countback of
- (a) the highest Stableford score for the individual events  
or  
(b) the highest sum of the Stableford scores for the players in the teams events in the following order: -
- 4.3.1 Last 18 holes  
4.3.2 Holes 10 to 18 (inclusive) of the last 18 holes  
4.3.3 Holes 16 to 18 (inclusive) of the last 18 holes  
4.3.4 18<sup>th</sup> hole of the last 18 holes.  
4.3.5 If still tied, the Match Committee shall decide how to determine the winner.

5. **Tournament Entry Forms**

- a. An Entry Form similar in detail to the form shown in Appendix 1 shall be prepared by the State Tournament Committee and a draft forwarded to the Executive Committee for approval prior to printing.
- b. The State Tournament committee shall distribute the Entry Form to Participating Rotarians at the preceding year’s Tournament.
- c. The State Tournament Committee shall distribute the Entry Forms to Past Participating Rotarians from the previous five (5) Tournaments.
- d. Editorial relating to Tournaments shall be directed to the Rotary Down Under Magazine, to each District Governor and each World Fellowship Activities Chairperson in Australia by the State Tournament Committee.

6. **Tournament Qualifications**

- a. Individual entries will only be accepted from Rotarians and guests who are financial Members of an affiliated Golf Club and who hold a current Australian handicap or equivalent. Proof of handicap shall be required by the Tournament Match Committee.

b. **Divisions**

Division 1	Rotarian golfer Handicap: - 0-15
Division 2	Rotarian golfer Handicap: - 16-23
Division 3	Rotarian golfer Handicap: - Men 24-36 Women 24 – 45
Division 4	One Division only for Guests Handicap: - Men 0-36 Women 0-45

- c. The minimum number of players in each Division of the Tournament shall be twelve. Should there be less than twelve entries in any of the divisions, then the organising Committee may arrange for players to be placed in another division.
- d. Team Events. Teams will be selected as follows;

All entrants will be listed in order of receipt, and midpoint of handicaps determined and participants paired, one from the upper half and one from the lower half. Pairings will be from different States, different Rotary Districts or different Rotary Clubs in that order.

- e. All entrants will be drawn in the Teams events. If there are an odd number of entries the last entrant will be paired with the first entrant received from the other half of the draw and from a different State.

## 7. **Trophies**

### 7.1 Teams Trophies will be presented for the following:

7.1.1 The “Clem Renouf” Trophy shall be awarded to the Rotarian Team with the highest Aggregate Stableford score.

7.1.1 The “Victoria” Trophy shall be awarded to the Rotarian Team with the second highest Aggregate Stableford score.

### 7.2 Individual Trophies: Trophies shall be awarded for the following:

7.2.1 The “Royce Abbey” Trophy shall be awarded to the Rotarian with the highest Individual Aggregate Stableford score and the title A.G.F.R. Champion with Handicap.

7.2.2 The “West Australian” Trophy shall be awarded to the Rotarian with the highest Individual Aggregate Stableford score and the title of A.G.F.R. Champion without Handicap.

7.2.3 The “South Australian” Trophy shall be awarded to the Division 1 player with the highest individual Aggregate Stableford score.

7.2.4 The “Tasmania” Trophy shall be awarded to the Division 2 player with the highest individual Aggregate Stableford score.

7.2.5 The “Northern Territory” Trophy shall be awarded to the Division 3 player with the highest individual Aggregate Stableford score.

7.2.6 The “Glen Kinross” Trophy shall be awarded to the player aged 65 years before the first day of the tournament with the highest Aggregate Stableford score.

7.2.7 The “Queensland” Trophy shall be awarded to the division 1 player with the second highest Individual Aggregate Stableford score.

7.2.8 The “New South Wales” Trophy shall be awarded to the Division 2 player with the second highest Individual Aggregate Stableford score.

7.2.9 The “Australian Capital Territory” Trophy shall be awarded to the Division 3 player with the second highest Individual Aggregate Stableford score.

### 7.3 Guests Trophies.

7.3.1 Guest Team with the highest Aggregate Stableford score.

7.3.2 Guest Team with the second highest Aggregate Stableford score.

7.3.3 Guest with the highest individual Aggregate Stableford score.

7.3.4 Guest with the second highest individual Aggregate Stableford score.

7.4 Perpetual Trophies shall not be taken out of Australia.

## 8 **Trophy Rating**

8.1 Trophies for each of the winners of the “Clem Renouf”, and the winners of the “Royce Abbey” and the “West Australian” Trophies shall be of equal value and be the most expensive trophies.

8.2 Trophies for each of the winners of the “Victoria” Trophy and the winners of the “South Australia” Trophy, the “Tasmania” Trophy, the “Northern Territory” Trophy and the “Glen Kinross” Trophy shall be of equal value, but of lesser value than those awarded to each of the winners of the Trophies listed in 8.1.

8.3 Trophies for each of the winners of the “Queensland” Trophy, the “New South Wales Trophy”, the “Australian Capital Territory” Trophy, the Guest Teams, and the Guest Individual Trophies, should be of equal value, but of a lesser value than those awarded to each of the winners of the trophies listed in 8.2.

8.4 Tournament organisers may donate any special prizes which shall be played for in that year only.

## 9 **Trophy Priority**

9.1 In the interest of Fellowship any participant shall receive only one trophy with the exception that the winners of the “Clem Renouf” and the “Victoria” Trophies may also receive an individual trophy.

9.2 The order of priority shall be:

- 9.2.1 The “Clem Renouf” Trophy.
- 9.2.2 The “Victoria” Trophy.
- 9.2.3 The “Royce Abbey” Trophy.
- 9.2.4 The “West Australia” Trophy.
- 9.2.5 The “South Australia” Trophy.
- 9.2.6 The “Tasmania” Trophy.
- 9.2.7 The “Northern Territory” Trophy
- 9.2.8 The “Glen Kinross” Trophy
- 9.2.9 The “Queensland” Trophy.
- 9.2.10 The “New South Wales” Trophy.
- 9.2.11 The “Australian Capital Territory” Trophy
- 9.2.12 Individual 18 Holes Division 1, 2 and 3 – Day 1.
- 9.2.13 Individual 18 Holes Division 1, 2 and 3 – Day 2.
- 9.2.14 Individual 18 Holes Division 1, 2 and 3 – Day 3 and 4 if applicable.
- 9.2.15 Guest Teams of 2. Best score.
- 9.2.16 Guest Teams of 2. Second best score.
- 9.2.17 Guest Individual. Best score.
- 9.2.18 Guest Individual. Second best score.

## 10 **Tournament Registration**

10.1 A registration fee shall be set by the State Tournament Committee to cover costs for Green Fees, a Cocktail Party to be held in the evening of the first day, a Presentation Banquet to be held in the evening of the final day, together with all administrative and organising costs, trophies etc.

10.2 The cost and administration of Fellowship functions organised by the State tournament Committee may not be included with the registration fee.
